
This **Graduation Event Kit** offers the following tools to help schools or families celebrate graduations at any age:

DECORATE & CELEBRATE

Whether you are planning a home or school celebration, this kit pulls out elements of the book for event decorations. Flip through this kit to locate flag pennants to print, cut and hang. Decorate your cupcakes or other food, straws and presents with small circle "toppers" featuring illustrations from the book. Look for higher-resolution stand-alone decoration files when you search "Wherever You Go" at Curious City DPW.com.

SCHOOL GRADUATION TRADITIONS

Here are some ideas that use the story and themes of **Wherever You Go** to create graduation celebration traditions at your school.

Encourage Adventure. Look for the Graduation Medallions in this kit. One side reads, "Want an adventure? Just open your door." The other side leaves room for a custom message like "Class of 2015." Follow the instructions on the sheet to make simple medallions to place over students' heads as they "walk" graduation. This could serve not only as a keepsake, but also as a continuous reminder to embrace adventures in learning.

Just Open Your Door. Could you work with your favorite set designer to have children pass through a door on stage when they "walk" graduation? Could you also have a blue bike on stage with you? What other visual and thematic aspects of the book could you add to your event?

Road to the New School. Imagine the allegorical roads in the book as the actual roads to a new school. Can you take your graduates on a "road trip" to their new school or classroom? Could the halls be the roads? Could you organize a walk or bike ride to the new school? Can you invite previous graduates to lead or greet the new students?

Books. If the book is this integrated into your graduation ceremony, should children be gifted with a copy signed by staff or should families have an opportunity to buy a copy at graduation? Contact a local bookseller to brainstorm ideas.



SAMPLE GRADUATION SPEECH

Consider reading Wherever You Go aloud at your graduation ceremony. Even without the audience being able to see the pictures, the book reads like a poem. A follow-up graduation speech could be something like:

The book Wherever You Go tells us that roads zoom, bend, reach, merge, grow, wait, climb, remember and return.
Is the story talking just about roads or is the story also telling us something about all of you.
I have watched the Class of:
Zoom toward new learning (and recess), bend their thinking to compromise with classmates, reach for a pencil when they have a new idea, and merge ideas on a group project.
I have watched the Class of:
Grow both in height and in knowledge, wait for others to catch up, and climb beside the ones they have waited for.
The book Wherever You Go tells us, "Want an adventure? Just open your door."
You are about to open the door of school for adventures envisioned and for some not yet imagined.
Remember the teachers, staff, students and experiences of school that set you on your road. Return to us someday and tell us of all your adventures on the road beyond our door.
You will be missed and you will be remembered.
You have been our adventure. Congratulations!




Graduation Medals

Whether they are stepping up to Kindergarten or going off to middle school, you can identify and honor your graduates by placing this medal around their necks as they enter the event or walk the stage. The front of the medal sends them off with an adventurous message and the back is reserved for your unique message. For example, Class of 2015!

Cut out both circles, af x them back-to-back, laminate, hole punch and string with a ribbon!


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


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

Cupcake Toppers, Gift Tags, Straw Toppers or Stickers

Print this sheet on white cardstock and cut out the circles with scissors or a 2-inch paper punch.

Cupcake Toppers: Paste backs & fronts with a lollipop stick, toothpick, or coffee stirrer in between.

Gift Tags: Paste backs & fronts and punch a hole for a ribbon or string.

Straw Toppers: Paste backs & fronts. Make a slit in the top & bottom with an Exacto knife. Slide straw thru slits.

Stickers: Print on sticker paper & cut out the circles with scissors or a 2-inch paper punch.
