"Tip tap toe to the left, spin around.

Toe tap tip to the right, stroke the ground.

Wings flip-flapping as you glide.






Making & Showing Your Claws




Fold an 8 1/2 " x 11" paper in half. Run your fingernail along the fold to make it sharper. Carefully tear on the fold.




You now have 2 sheets of paper.




Cross the papers to make a perfect square. Take one section that is not a part of the square and fold it under.




Run your fingernail along the fold to make it sharper.




Carefully tear on the fold and start working with the square piece.




Fold the square corner to corner until you have made a perfect triangle.



Open the paper back up.




Take a corner (that is not connected to your crease) and fold it towards the crease.




Take the opposite corner and do the same.




Fold the kite-shape in half, tucking your other folds inside.




Fold the bottom up to bisect the obtuse angle.




The distance does not need to be exact but generally about half way up the length of the paper.




Fold the protruding section of the paper around and behind.




Fold the protruding section one more time around.




Tuck the tip of the paper under the layer.



Pry open the paper layers and insert your finger.



You now hve a claw to show.



Ifyou want to transform the claw into a bird puppet, add a beak and eyes.
